- Innovative hands-on book and reading program that has been successfully implemented at memory care facilities.
- *Tales and Travel* takes participants on an imaginary trip to a different country or region of the U.S. using library materials.
- The program engages participants in activities such as reading out loud, browsing through books, listening to music, interacting with destination souvenirs and joining in conversation with library staff/volunteers.
