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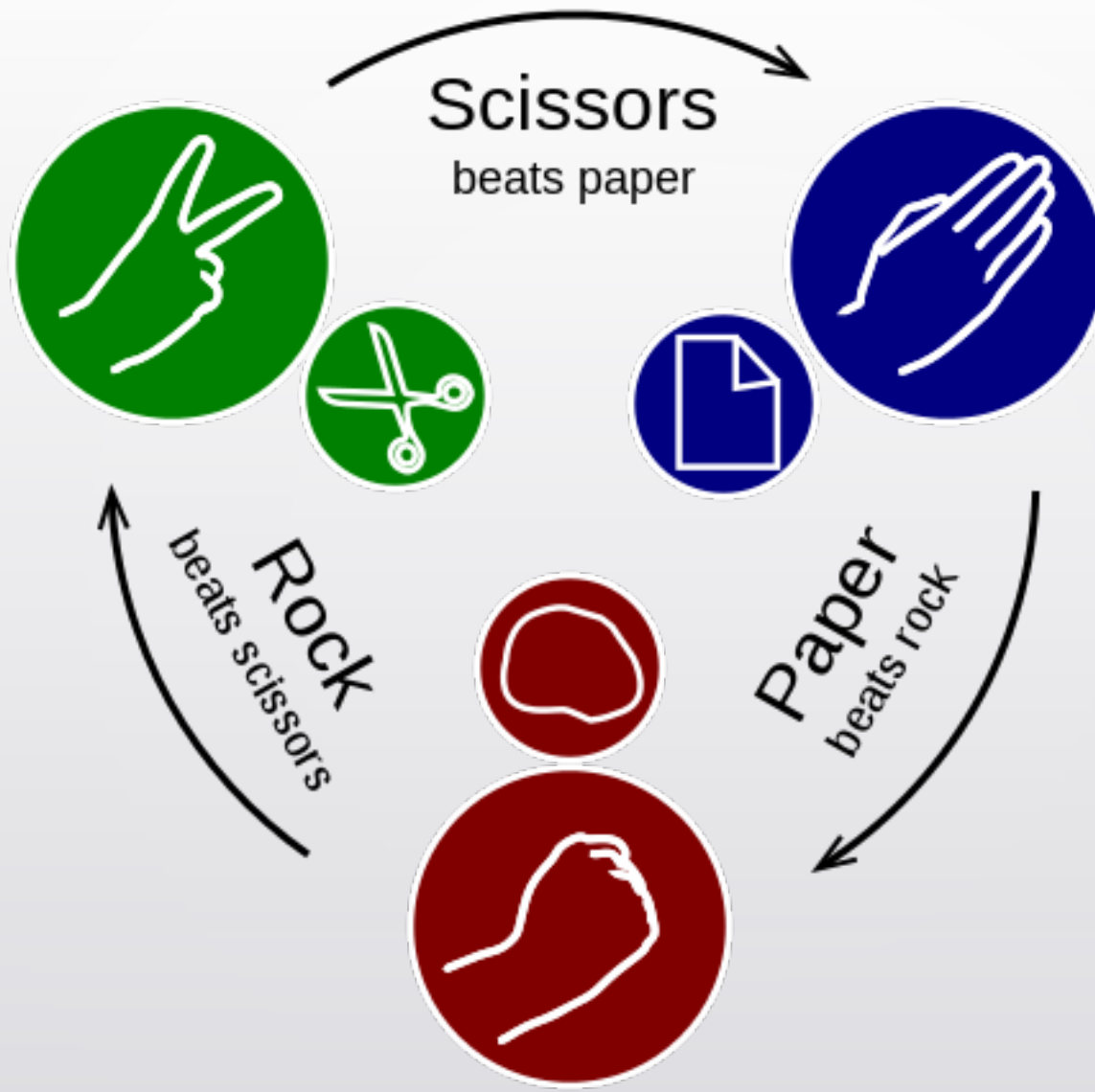

open = free + permissions

What is OA?

“Open-access (OA) literature is digital, online, free of charge, and free of most copyright and licensing restrictions. What makes it possible is the internet and the consent of the author or copyright-holder.”

What are Open Educational Resources (OER)?

“Open Educational Resources (**OER**) are free and openly licensed educational materials* that can be used for teaching, learning, research, and other purposes.”

*Materials may include course content or materials, textbooks, videos, software, etc.

The 5Rs of OER (permissions)

- Retain
- Reuse
- Revise
- Remix
- Redistribute

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The 5Rs of OER (permissions)

- **Retain** - the right to make, own, and control copies of the content
 - e.g., download, duplicate, store, and manage
- **Reuse** - the right to use the content in a wide range of ways
 - e.g., in a class, in a study group, on a website, in a video

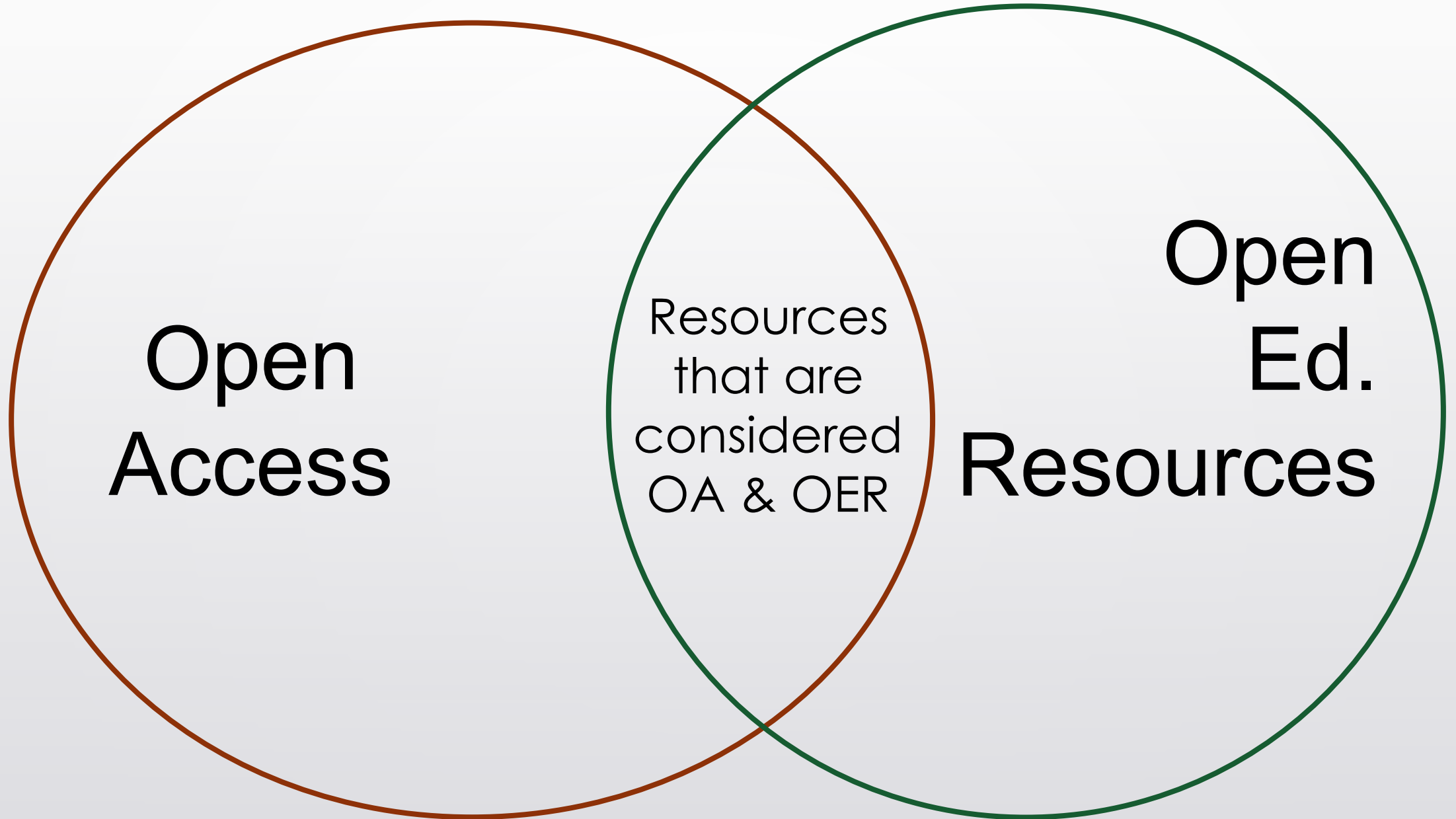
The 5Rs of OER (permissions)

- **Revise** - the right to adapt, adjust, modify, or alter the content itself
 - e.g., translate the content into another language
- **Remix** - the right to combine the original or revised content with other material to create something new
 - e.g., incorporate the content into a mashup

The 5Rs of OER (permissions)

- **Redistribute** - the right to share copies of the original content, your revisions, or your remixes with others
 - e.g., give a copy of the content to a friend

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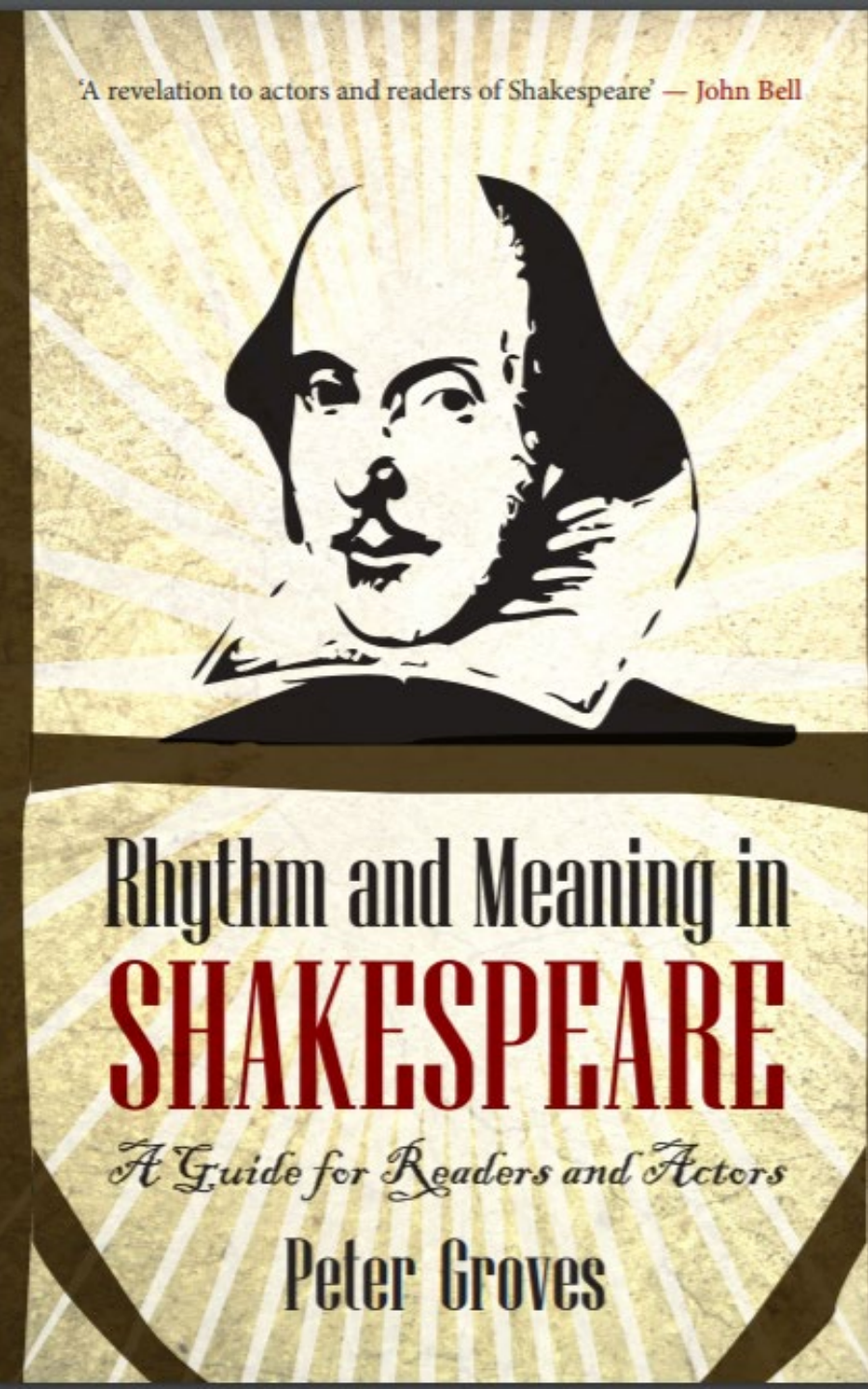
